
Missouri Boating Statistics & Drownings



Introduction


This booklet is published by the Missouri State Highway Patrol as an aid to persons who are interested in recreational boating crashes and accidental drowning incidents occurring in the state. It contains information which provides a comprehensive look at statewide crashes and accidental drowning incidents as experienced in 2012.

The Missouri State Highway Patrol is the central recreational boating data collection agency for the State of Missouri. The Patrol investigates all recreational boating crashes occurring in the state and either investigates or gathers data on accidental drowning incidents occurring in state and private waters.

Interesting Statistics

Here at a glance are some interesting statistics found in this booklet:

- In 2012 there were 12 persons killed and 99 persons injured in recreational boating crashes in the State of Missouri. This was seven fewer killed and 12 more injured than in 2011. There was an increase of 17% in total crashes statewide compared to 2011.
- In 2012 there were 194 total crashes including 109 property damage only, 75 injury, and 10 fatal.
- "Water conditions" was the leading contributing circumstance for all crashes followed by "excessive speed." Alcohol was known to have been a contributing circumstance on 40 crashes statewide.
- Capsizing type crashes resulted in the deaths of four persons. This was 33% of the total persons killed in crashes.
- Of all crashes reported statewide, 82.5% (160) occurred during the months of May through August.
- Most crashes occurred on Saturday (65) and Sunday (42) and most occurred between noon and 8:00 p.m.
- Of all crashes reported statewide, 75% (145) involved only one watercraft. Eight of the ten fatal crashes involved only one watercraft.
- Of 243 boat operators involved in crashes, 124 had no prior boater education.
- In 2012, there were 17 persons killed in accidental drowning incidents occurring in state waters, 18 less than in 2011. In addition, the Missouri State Highway Patrol investigated four accidental drowning incidents that occurred on private property.
- Most drowning incidents occurred on Thursday (5) and Friday (5) and most occurred during the months of July (5) and August (5).







Alcohol Involvement

Drinking and Crashes - Whether or not a person has been drinking cannot always be determined at the scene of a crash. It is generally impossible to determine the persons who have had one or a few drinks; yet, these individuals may be as much of a hazard as the obvious drunk. Because of the time lapse from the moment of occurrence until an officer arrives at the scene to make the investigation, a person's condition concerning drinking can change a great deal. In cases where the individual may have been removed to a hospital, doctor's office or funeral home, his condition may never be determined.






